

THE CONCEPT OF THE STATE EUROPEAN SCHOOL BERLIN

Teaching in Two Languages

Dual language education from year one: every State European School Berlin (SESB) offers dual language education in one of nine possible language combinations.

Berlin Leaving School Qualifications

The SESB provides a bilingual path to all Berlin state school leaving qualifications. Year 10 is completed with the "Mittlerer Schulabschluss (MSA)" (Certificate of Secondary Education) and Year 12 or Year 13 with the "Abitur" (University Entry Diploma).

Language Certificate

In addition, graduating students receive a language certificate certifying the language level of the student – language level B2 for the MSA and C2 for the Abitur according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

Curricula

Teaching is based on the Berlin curricula in combination with the SESB curricula.

Learning groups

Students in one class sometimes work in separate groups according to their first language. They learn about the culture of their partner language but also keep their own cultural and national identity through their own language.

Admissions

Children who apply to start school at an SESB school take a language test as part of the admissions procedure. A later enrolment is possible if places are available and particular requirements are fulfilled, such as the ability to learn in both languages.

LESSONS AND INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE

Teaching and Learning

Half the lessons are taught in one language and half in the other language. Teachers use their first language.

Second foreign language

Students with the combination English and German start studying French from year five as their second foreign language.

Exchanges and practical experience

SESB schools cooperate closely with each other and networking and connecting with institutions and people from other countries are an integral part of life at an SESB school.

Trips and internships as well as participation in lessons at partner schools abroad provide hands-on experience.

The majority of SESB schools have been awarded the certificate "Excellent European Education" and are dedicated to promoting European awareness.

Learning Together

In each class students from different countries with different first languages learn with and from each other.

This intercultural education enables students to keep their cultural identity whilst encouraging them to develop their own views and reflect on their individual perspectives.
